Family Fun Events

Westminster Fall Fest

One of the largest annual events in Carroll County is the Westminster Fall Fest. The community event begins Sept. 26, and goes through Sept. 29, featuring a parade, amusement rides and lots of food. Local entertainment includes performances from a country band, a high school boy band and a classic rock group.

There are over 80 different craft vendors and eight free demonstrations from groups like a yoga studio, a police dog trainer, a juggler and karate group. Also, Midnight Madness is a special shopping event that takes place on Sept. 27, from 6 p.m. to midnight. Local shops in downtown Westminster stay open for an exclusive shopping and dining experience.

But what's really special about Fall Fest is that all their profits go to local charities. This year, Fall Fest is supporting four new nonprofit organizations: the Special Olympics - Mary-

land, Carroll County, the Stacey Davis Breast Cancer Fund, the Westminster Lions Club and the Good News Jail & Prison Ministry.

Robin Cherney, city representative of Westminster and a member of the 2013 Fall Fest Board, describes the event as a festival that includes craft vendors, local vendors and has a carnival attached to it. She believes there really is something fun to do for all ages, and especially recommends checking out the bands and attending Midnight Madness.

"Because it's at the end of September, people have had a month of being back into their routine," says Cherney. "This weekend gives folks an opportunity to meet up with friends at a festival that has a carnival feel to it. It's a last hooray for summer that welcomes fall."

of work, the Maryland Wine Festival is the place to go. Whether your refrigerator is stacked with Franzia, or you have a bottle of Chateau Lafite Rothschild Pauillac in your wine cellar, the world-famous festival is sure to be a good time.

Taking place on Saturday, September 21 10 a.m.-6 p.m. and Sunday, September 22, noon to 6 p.m. at the Carroll County Farm Museum, the Maryland Wine Festival's 30th anniversary celebration is a great place to kick back and enjoy. Bonnie Hood, events and marketing coordinator, said it's a perfect September event because it "introduces fall" and is a great place to learn about wine.

While sampling a variety of Maryland's wines, check out some local artists' crafts for purchase, and learn how to sip and savor wine at one of the seminars. Hood cautions, "It's not about guzzling, it's about learning." But she says not to be intimidated – the atmosphere is very laidback and friendly.

So purchase a ticket ahead of time online at www.mary-landwine.org, grab a friend and come out to the festival for a relaxing day at the Farm Museum.

8th Annual Maryland Microbrewery Festival

If wine isn't your drink of choice, Maryland's Microbrewery Festival at the Unions Mills Homestead could be for you.

On Sept. 28 from 11 a.m. to 7 p.m. the fun-filled event will celebrate and promote Maryland's very own microbrews. With



11 breweries and more than 30 different brands of beer, this festival is a great way to enhance your knowledge about beer and brewing while enjoying all-day entertainment and live music.

Plus, don't forget to check out the craft vendors and the wide selection of food, ranging from hot dogs, pit beef and turkey to funnel cakes and snow cones that will be available to purchase from vendors all day.

Also, attend 20-minute basic homebrewing seminars at 11:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m., or advanced homebrewing seminars at 1 p.m. and 4 p.m. to learn more about the brewing process. Although you don't need to attend a seminar to see brewing in action, active brewing takes place throughout the day.

For adults 21 and over, tickets may be purchased online atmarylandmicrobreweryfestival.com in advance for \$18, or \$20 at the door. Non-beer samplers 12 and older can buy a ticket for \$5 in advance and at the door.

So this September, make a pact with yourself to take time every day to relax and do something fun. Whether it's simply going for a run in one of Carroll County's beautiful parks or taking the family to Taneytown's Family Fun Days, make each day a continuation of the happy, carefree summer spirit.



At the Parks

The parks throughout Carroll County offer many opportunities for outdoor recreation.

Bennett Cerf Dog Park

Bennett Cerf Dog Park is a large fenced in area where dogs are permitted to be taken off-leash to exercise and socialize with other dogs in a safe environment. This is the only area in any Carroll County park where dogs are permitted off leash. Many backyards do not give dogs enough room to run. Veterinarians agree exercise and socialization contributes to a well-adjusted dog. Dog parks provide excellent opportunities for dog owners to socialize as well. The dog park is open to paid members only. To become a member, visit www.bennettcerfdogpark.org or call 410-386-2103.

The Sports Complex

The Sports Complex is the home of numerous adult recreational sports leagues in Carroll County. The Complex hosts weekend softball tournaments from mid-March through early November with sanctioned softball tournaments being held by Maryland USSSA, Maryland ISA, Maryland USSSA Youth, Maryland NSA Youth, and the Maryland Stars.

Trails

The Carroll County Trail maps show public recreational trails that are located in Carroll County. There are a total of 12 trails that run through the parks. Go to the Recreation website for trail maps.

Bear Branch Nature Center

Hashawha and Bear Branch Nature Center at John Owings Rd. The Nature Center is open year round. Hashawha's trails are open to the public from dawn until dusk 365 days a year. Parking is only available at Lake Hashawha or Bear Branch Nature Center. There is no entrance fee for the park.

Piney Run Park & Nature Center

"Open Season" for the Center is April 1 through Oct. 31; park gates are open 7 days a week from 7 a.m. until sunset. "Off season" is considered Nov. 1 through March 31; park gates are open weekdays 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and are closed on the weekend.
